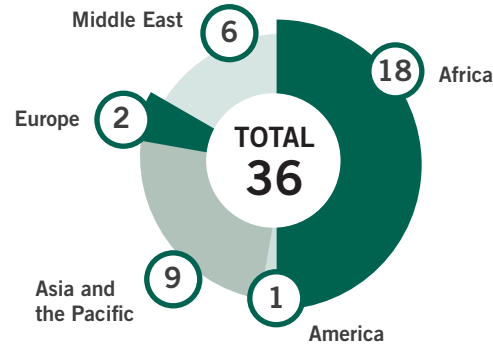


Armed conflicts in the world in 2023



In 2023 almost half (47%) of the armed conflicts in the world were of high intensity, with grave consequences in terms of lethality and human security



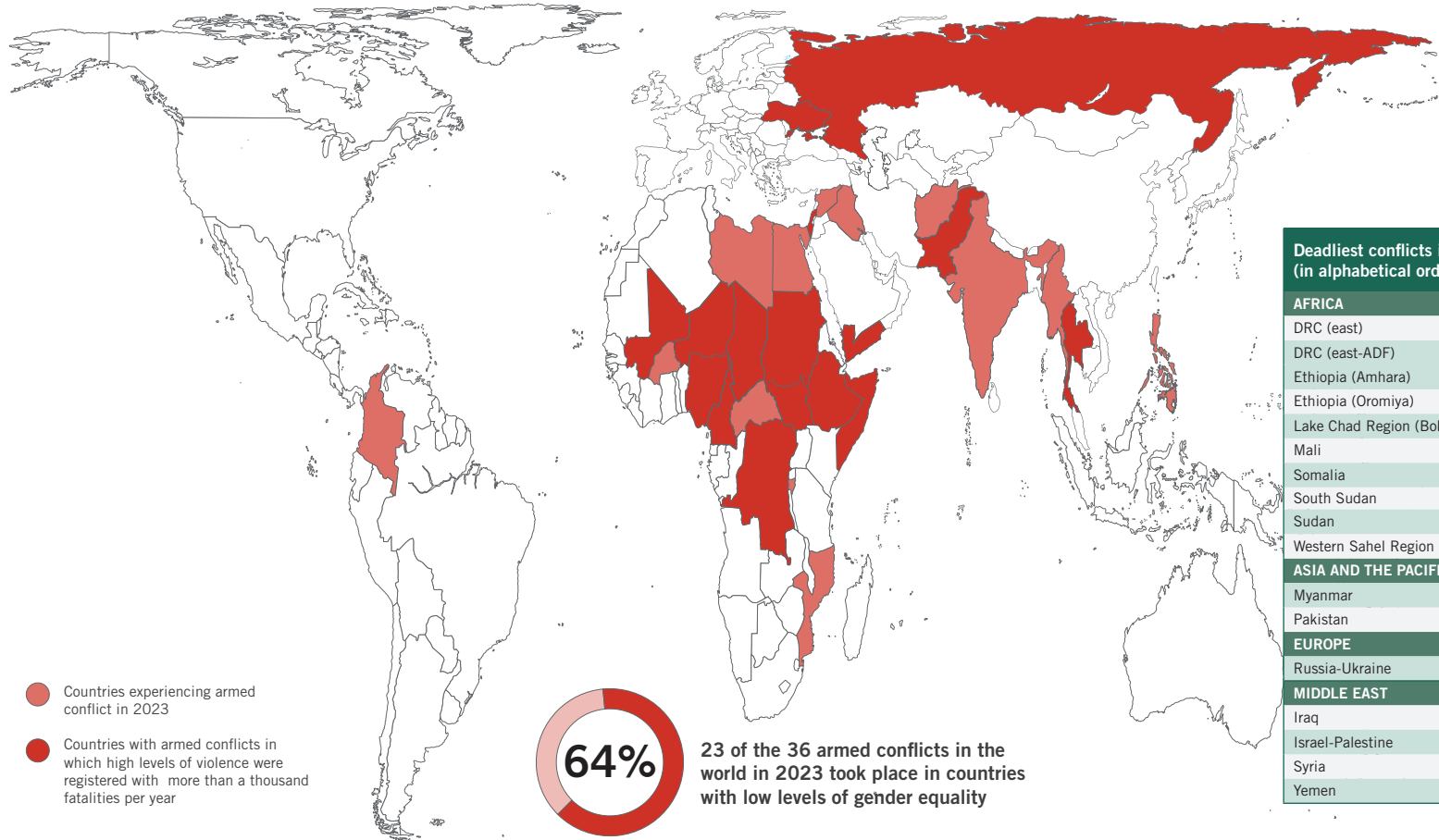
Although most armed conflicts continued to be internationalised internal, the number of internal and international cases increased



42% of the armed conflicts worsened, with rising levels of violence in 2023

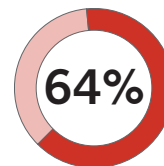
