



Armed conflicts in the world in 2021




By the end of the year, the 32 armed conflicts identified in 2021 remained active

Intensity of armed conflicts



The intensity of the armed conflicts in 2021 accentuated the trend of an increase in serious cases, contexts characterised by levels of lethality of over a thousand victims per year and other serious impacts on the population and the territory

The trending rise in high-intensity armed conflicts intensified in 2021, accounting for more than half (53%) of them for the first time in a decade




By the end of 2020, there were 82.4 million forcibly displaced people worldwide, more than double the number a decade ago. UNHCR forecasts with the data available for the first half of 2021 indicated that the figure had already exceeded
