Dear Professor Saaty,

I have received your two letters of the 31th october and the 30th november. Some day ago I sent you by separate post as printed matter the reprintings of some of my papers, as you asked me to do.

I send you herewith a letter of Prof. Mandelbrojt in which he gives his opinion on my works. On the other hand Prof. Beas lets me know he will be glad to inform favourably if the Office of Naval Research comes to consult him about my mathematical work. You may as well ask for advice Prof. Macintyre of University of Cincinnati who is well acquainted with my production.

I should like to avail myself of this opportunity for pointing out that my full name being F. Sunyer Balaguer, the family name (as used in every other country) is SUNYER, whereas the name Balaguer is the name of my mother and is used in my country only as a compliment to the mother.
