Dear Professor Sunyer:

I wish to review for you the privileges and opportunities which now belong to you as a member of the American Mathematical Society.

The Society holds twelve meetings throughout the year in various parts of the country, the times and places being announced on the third cover page of the BULLETIN. About two weeks before each meeting a printed copy of the program will be sent to you. As a member of the Society, it is your privilege to present papers at these meetings. Before a paper can be placed on the program of a meeting, an abstract must be submitted to and approved by the Associate Secretary in charge of the meeting. The abstract should be submitted on a blank prepared for this purpose which may be secured from any one of the Secretaries.

As a member of the Society, you will receive the BULLETIN OF THE AMERICAN MATHEMATICAL SOCIETY which appears twelve times a year and contains short research papers, book reviews, news items and official notices, and abstracts of papers presented at meetings. These abstracts are arranged according to subject, so that you will be able to follow readily the latest developments in the field of your particular interest.

In addition, the Society publishes the TRANSACTIONS OF THE AMERICAN MATHEMATICAL SOCIETY, a journal for longer research papers, MATHEMATICAL REVIEWS, a reviewing and abstracting journal, COLLOQUIUM PUBLICATIONS, a series of books presenting new research in advanced mathematical subjects; MATHEMATICAL SURVEYS, a series of monographs furnishing expositions of the principal methods and results in particular fields. The Society also cooperates with The Johns Hopkins University in publishing the AMERICAN JOURNAL OF MATHEMATICS and contributes to the support of the CANADIAN JOURNAL OF MATHEMATICS. As a member of the Society, you may subscribe for these publications at reduced rates, the reduction amounting in some cases to as much as fifty per cent. For your convenience, a fuller description of our publications and an order card are enclosed with this letter. As a member of the Society, you are privileged to borrow books from the Library of the Society which is housed at Columbia University. A copy of the new Catalogue of the Library has recently been mailed to you.

Other details concerning the work of the Society and the conduct of its activities will be found in the reports of meetings published in the BULLETIN. If you have any particular questions about the Society at any time, I shall be glad to answer them.
