Dear Professor Balaguer:

I was pleased to receive a copy of Dr. Leila D. Bram's letter to you indicating that the Office of Naval Research would be pleased to consider a proposal for a continuation of U. S. Navy support of your research for an additional two years. As your present contract N62558-3079 expires on 30 June 1962, I would recommend, if you are interested in this continuation, that you submit a renewal proposal as soon as possible.

A renewal proposal should include (a) a brief statement of accomplishments during the current contract year, (b) a statement of the objectives of a proposed extension of the research, (c) a budget breakdown for the two additional years' work such as you submitted in your August 1961 letter to Dr. Leila Bram and (d) a statement that the continuation of U. S. Navy support of your research has the approval of your University authorities.

I suggest that you send the original and two copies of the renewal proposal directly to Dr. Bram, Code 432, Office of Naval Research, Department of the Navy, Washington 25, D. C. Would you also please send two copies of your renewal proposal to this Office; one copy will be retained for our files and the second copy would be for the use of the Navy Purchasing Office, London in amending the contract after your renewal proposal is approved. If we can be of any further assistance to you in this matter, please advise us.

I am tentatively planning to be in Spain from 10-16 May 1961. Would it be convenient for me to visit you in Barcelona on Monday, 14 May? If this suggested time is not satisfactory to you please do not hesitate to so indicate.
