 - (✓) Whenever possible, it is highly recommended because you keep the rights and save yourself from having to resort to the work of others.
- 1 Use open access content



(✓) Use the "usage rights" filter in Google's <u>advanced search</u>
And if you want to search for images on Google, remember that <u>Google</u>
<u>Images</u> allows searching restricted by license. See <u>how</u> to do it
