We are delighted indeed with your letter of February 20, 1964, and with your excellent article which we read with great interest and the continuation of which we await with high expectation.

The editors are of the opinion that the article is of very high quality and meets the requirements of the Encyclopaedia in a superior manner. They have noted, in point of specific detail, that it may be advisable to reduce the passages referring to personalities who did not deal extensively with the natural sciences and mathematics or with what we now call the exact sciences and rather addressed themselves to the humanities, such as philosophy, philology, ethics, poetry, and grammar. Similarly, it would seem desirable to limit the biographical data of personalities on whom it is very likely that separate articles will be written.

We agree to the length of 40-50 pages and shall, of course, reimburse you for the expenses you incur for copying and mailing the typescript. Your remuneration will be four (4) cents per word. I look forward to hearing from you soon again.
