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LEGAL FRAMEWORK



Universal declaration of Human Rights

Article 29 is about the right to take part in politics.

This article says that all people with disabilities have the same right to take part in politics as other citizens.

The Convention also asks governments to make sure that people with disabilities have the same chances to take part in politics as anyone else.











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One person one vote

However, in many countries, persons with cognitive disabilities cannot vote

Discrimination

People with disabilities should have the same right to vote. No one should declare a person incapable of voting. No one should test if a person with disability is able to vote.











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Some issues



The polling station is hard to find and enter.

People do not know about their right to vote or stand for elections.

Information about elections and voting is difficult to understand.







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First step to voting: census

Each election has a deadline to consult the census. Is this information accessible? How is the information communicated to the population? The consultation is accessible?







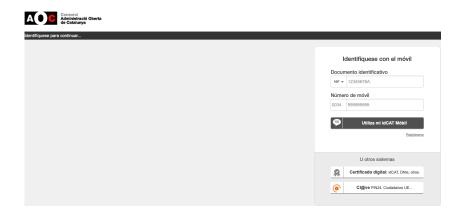

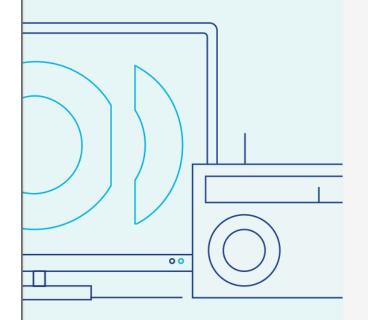

IN TRADITIONAL MEDIA

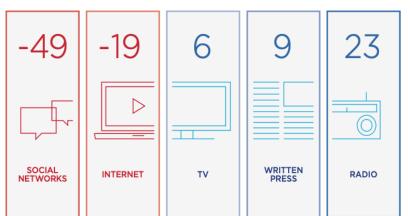
Legacy media remain trusted sources of information in times of crisis, whereas trust in social networks continues to decline



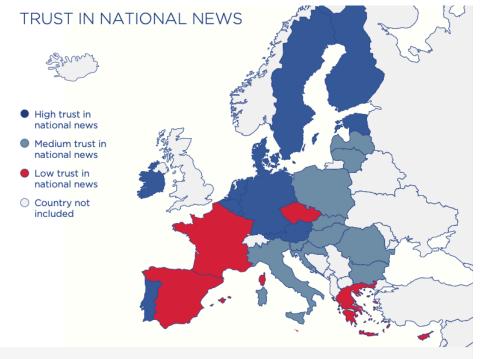
RADIO IS MOST TRUSTED

The more citizens perceive their national PSM to be free from political pressure, the higher the level of trust in national news in general

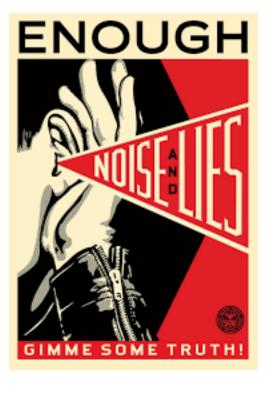

Allowing a person with disability to choose someone to help them express their choice in elections, like an assistant.

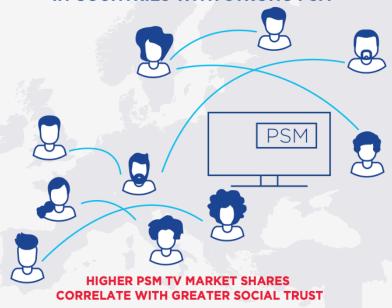

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ACTION

1.Involving people with disabilities in politics

The Convention asks governments to involve people with disabilities when making decisions about their lives.

Some governments also support organisations of people with disabilities.

This is to make sure they can help the government with things that are important to people with disabilities.

For example, these organisations can tell the government if things are bad for people with disabilities or if they are good and help them.

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ACTION

2. Collecting information

how many people with disabilities take part in politics what makes it difficult for people with disabilities to take part, what support people with disabilities need to take part.







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ACTION

3. Working together

Countries should work together to make it easier or people with disabilities to take part in politics.

However, only very few countries do that.

For example Australia helped to make elections in Indonesia, Papua New Guinea and the Philippines more accessible.

All EU citizens have the right to vote for and stand as a candidate in European Parliament elections in their country of origin, or if they live in another EU country, they may choose to vote and stand as a candidate, under the same conditions as the
