How? Phase 1- Curriculum Analysis (1/2)



• 2023

 Focus group discussion based on fields by UNESCO International Standard Classification of Education

Selected fields:

Education; Arts and Humanities; Social Sciences, Journalism and Information;
Business, Administration and Law; ICT; Engineering and Construction, and Health and Welfare





How? Phase 1- Curriculum Analysis (2/2)



Selection of a sample of curricula and syllabi (BA/MA).

Selection of keywords.

- Two-level corpus analysis
 - First-level: key words using Sketch Engine.
 - Second-level: thematic analysis.

Outcome: mapping of accessibility & design for all.





How? Phase 2- Recommendations



2024

- Legal situation across countries
- Focus groups to agree on a series of recommendations
- Examples: 5 BA/MA.
