Objective

The aim of the course is to undertake an analysis of political culture and public opinion in the European Union with particular emphasis on the process of integration, on selected policy issues and on democratic participation at the supranational level. The evidence from Eurobarometer studies over more than two decades will be critically examined and all empirical findings will be placed in a broader theoretical and institutional context. The course does not presuppose prior methodological or statistical skill or experience but should contribute to developing the student's critical appreciation of empirical research.
