BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF CONTENT:

The course opens with a description of the structure of standard English words following structural models.

We go on with the assessment of morphological theories such as morpheme-based vs. word-based morphology. Word formation processes. Listedness. Constraints on productivity. Insights of lexical morphology into the structure of words. Level ordering and conversion. The interfaces of morphology with other constituents.

METHOD OF ASSESSMENT:

- Class participation and home assignments 20%
- One class presentation on a previously assigned topic 20%
- The review of three relevant articles in the field of Morphology/Lexicology 20%
- A final written examination 40%

Note: The level of English will be taken into account when assessing hand-in work, exams and in the final grade.
