BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF SUBJECT

This subject aims at dealing with the main issues related to the Victorian Period through the reading of four representative texts: three long novels and an autobiography.

OBJECTIVES

Literatura en Llengua Anglesa del segle XIX aims at teaching students to:

- Understand and consider the main cultural and literary issues shaping Victorianism and how they still relate to our immediate cultural context.
- Read in detail a selection of prominent 19th century texts in English.
- Develop adavanced skills in literary criticism by taking part in class discussion of these texts.

Assessment Description:

- Class participation: Students are expected to contribute to class discussion of the texts.

- Exams: Students are expected to take four exams, one for each text taught in the course, that should correspond to two mid-term and two end-of-term exams.
