BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF SUBJECT

This course, subtitiled "Comparative Ethnic Identities in American film, Music, and Literature", explores the complex issues of race and ethnicity by examining the fictional works of major American writers, musicians, and film makers. The readings are part of the public discourse on race and ethnicity in America, and seek to engage the complex worlds that mirror and complement race and ethnic matters in the world.

OBJECTIVES

The course will **interrogate** literary texts, cinematic images, and musical ideas as a way to **identify** a variety of social, political, historical, and cultural forces that have impacted on how race and ethnicity are constructed in the United States. Students will be encouraged to **understand the differences** and **highlight the similarities** that African Americans, American Indians, and Chicanos encounter as historically marginalized people and as people crucial to the development and progress of America and its national character.
