Classes are conducted in English. The final level required will be the equivalent of First Certificate Cambridge (see Anglès Instrumental I).

OBJECTIVES

To learn how to read the texts attentively.

To develop the basic skills of literary criticism.

To participate in class discussion.

To understand the main traits of the evolution of English literature in the 20 century.

To write brief critical essays on literary texts in English.

To use the UAB libraries and other resources in order to compile a basic bibliography.
