### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF SUBJECT**

This is an intermediate syntax subject. The theoretical approach introduced in *English Syntax* is developed and other structures are considered. The properties of English interrogatives, passives, finite and non-finites embedded clauses are studied and analyzed wihtin the framework of generative grammar.
