SUBJECT: ALTRES LITERATURES EN LLENGUA ANGLESA

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BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF SUBJECT

This course focuses on one subject: representations of Africa in modern literature, starting from Joseph Conrad's controversial novella *Heart of Darkness*. We will study responses to his fiction of all sorts, paying particular attention to Achebe's critical essay, which leads us to debates on colonialism, postcolonialism and contemporary representations. Brief explorations of film, music and art will play a small but important role.

OBJECTIVES

The purpose of the course is to

- acquaint students with great literature written on and about Africa.
- introduce the student to the major post-colonial debates.

SYLLABUS

 Introduction to postcolonial theory and its central issues, such as rewriting colonial discourse, nationalism, the language question, representation, gender, sexuality, amongst others.

Close reading of the following texts in this order:

- Joseph Conrad, Heart of Darkness (1899) (The Norton Critical edition, edited by Paul B. Armstrong, ISBN 0-393-92636-2 is highly recommended).
- o V. S. Naipaul, A Bend in the River (1979)
- o Doris Lessing, The Grass is Singing (1950)
- o J.M. Coetzee, *Disgrace*, (2000)
