BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF SUBJECT

This is a basic syntax course. Fundamental syntactic concepts are introduced and then practised with exercises. The approach to the analysis of English syntax is formal, a basic generativist framework is followed and the relation between semantics and syntax is especially emphasized.
