BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF SUBJECT

This is an intermediate syntax subject. The theoretical approach introduced in *English Syntax* is developed and other structures are considered. The properties of English interrogatives, passives, finite and non-finite embedded clauses are studied and analyzed within the framework of generative grammar.

OBJECTIVES

The main objective of the subject is to provide the students with sufficient insight into the structure of English so that they can understand essential syntactic operations (such as whmovement and NP-movement) and grasp the importance of fundamental syntactic elements (such as different types of empty elements, PRO and traces).
