Security and Development in the MENA region

In today's world, security and development, the two public goods to be provided by the States, are directly related. Conflict, peace building and social and economic development take on a global and inclusive dimension which requires a multidisciplinary analysis. To carry out this analysis, necessary to act on the ground, a deep knowledge and understanding of theoretical models and basic practical experiences related to security and development are required. We must also have the capacity to analyze both the dynamics of conflict, and of cooperation in negotiations and peace building. The actors involved in these dynamics are becoming more pluralistic, requiring once again, to give a multidisciplinary dimension to both theories and methodologies for analysis and work. In developing the module, the comparison between different case studies in the Mediterranean region will be encouraged, with the objective to acquire the ability to analyze and work in different contexts.

Objectives:

1. To achieve a deep understanding of the various concepts, theoretical models and methodological tools existing in the field of security studies and development
2. Demonstrate understanding and knowledge of the main conflicts and peace processes have played out in Mediterranean
3. To know and be able to critically evaluate the theory and practice of human development and human security
4. To be able to find and develop information on conflicts, peace processes and development processes in the Mediterranean region and, where appropriate, undertaking research in this area
5. To be able to apply the main tools of intervention in the frame of the theory and practice of security and development
6. To get the competencies and knowledge to perform the various skills in professional settings (national and international NGOs, etc.).
