Segueix un anàlisi de la Unió Econòmica i Monetària Europea, del mercat interior i de la presa de decisions de les institucions europees.

En les diferents sessions d'aquest mòdul s'estudien les polítiques de la UE: des de la política de competència fins a la política de comerç exterior, passant per les polítiques internes, la política agrària, la política regional i la política social.

Monogràficament es presenten les euro crisi, euroimbalances, iniciatives de la Unió com la de reformes estructurals Europa 2020, el pla Juncker d'Inversions Estratègiques, els procediments a propòsit de desequilibris macroeconòmics , el Semestre Europeu, els mecanismes d'estabilitat financera i de rescat, els avenços en sostenibilitat i la competitivitat, els reptes d'Europa en relació a la productivitat, l'ocupació i l'envelliment, així com la cohesió social als Estats Membres de la Unió.
