Objectives and Contextualisation

The training objective of the course is that the student knows how to contextualize the great movements and currents of 20th century Catalan literature in the context of universal literary traditions. Likewise, the student must know the authors and the most relevant works and must be familiar with the fundamental bibliography of the period and with the reading strategies that allow him to elaborate a critical discourse.

The theoretical sessions with all the students have a panoramic and contextual character and are accompanied by the commentary of theoretical-critical texts. The sessions devoted to reading focus on the analysis of compulsory reading works and other complementary texts. Students have a list of books and related bibliographic references for compulsory reading.
