Objectives and Contextualisation

The subject "Public Safety Management" is a subject of 6 compulsory credits that is taught in the second year of the Degree in Prevention and Integral Security.
This subject is part of the subject Preventive Regulation, and as such studies the regulation of security, specifically from public safety management.

Assessment

The evaluation system of this subject is based on the CONTINUED EVALUATION system
This is structured in two clearly differentiated sections:

1. Evaluation of the topics worked in the classroom and continuous evaluation

Exercises and problems: delivery of exercises, assignments and problems that arise in class.

The mark of these exercises (4 points (maximum mark) with respect to the final mark of the subject) will be added to the average obtained from the individual theoretical tests provided that they have been passed under the conditions specified in the following section *.

2. Individual theoretical tests

Exam: individual, written or oral tests, which allow to assess the knowledge acquired by the student.

The student must pass two tests. The value of them is 3 each with respect to the final grade of the subject. Being the total value of 6 points out of 10.

The tests / exams may be written and / or oral at the discretion of the teaching staff.

* The student who obtains a 2.4 out of 6 of the set of theoretical tests will be able to add the grade obtained from the practical part.

Final exam

The student who does not pass the subject, who does not reach a 5 (total) out of 10, in accordance with the criteria established in the two previous sections may take a final exam as long as:

The student has been evaluated in a set of activities, the weight of which amounts to a minimum of two thirds of the total grade of the subject.

This exam will reevaluate all the contents of the subject.

In the case of passing the final exam the subject will be passed with a maximum of 5, regardless of the grade obtained in the exam.

Students who need to change an evaluation date must submit the request by filling in the document found in the moodle space of Tutoring EPSI.

Without prejudice to other disciplinary measures deemed appropriate, and in accordance with current academic regulations, "in case the student makes any irregularity that may lead to a significant variation in the grade of an evaluation act, it will be scored with a 0 this act of evaluation, regardless of the disciplinary process that can be instructed. In the event of various irregularities in the acts of evaluation of the same subject, the final grade for this subject will be 0 ".
