Objectives and Contextualisation

Skills and competences for the understanding of the problem of gender relations.

Understand and analyze gender inequalities

Know and be able to analyze gender policies from a sociological perspective

Competences

- Analysing the problems arising from the implementation of public policies and conflict situations by recognising the complexity of the social phenomena and political decisions affecting democracy, human rights, social justice and sustainable development.

7. Distinguishing sociological concepts, as well as the methods and techniques of social investigation commonly used to analyse social policy.
8. Distinguishing underlying social policies of specific conflicts.

10. Relating the explanations of the access inequalities and the impact of social policies with the general theoretical and methodological debates.

Content

The contents of the subject included 5 topics:

1. The sociology of gender
 - 1.1. The construction of the research question and main currents
 - 1.2. Conflict, subordination, exploitation, domination
2. The study of masculinities
 - 2.1. Masculinities and gender perspective
 - 2.2. New masculinities: hegemony, subordination, complicity, marginality
3. Sexuality and gender
 - 3.1. Sociology of sexuality
 - 3.2. Field of study: social construction, sexual identity, practices and policies
4. Gender policies

- 4.1. A brief history of equality policies: origins, resistance and challenges
- 4.2. Gender justice: feminist and LGTBI agendas
- 5. The analysis of public policies from a gender perspective
 - 5.1. The measure of gender inequalities
 - 5.2. Gender assessment and impact of public policies

Methodology

The sessions will combine:

- Theoretical teaching presentations
- Seminars to discuss readings, research and proposals for action
- Group tutorials

Assessment

- 1) Seminar based on the critical reading of a text proposed by the teacher, a student will present a poster about it. (20%)
- 2) Essay I: based on the readings worked on during seminars I, II and III, students will prepare a critical essay. (20%)
- 3) Essay II: based on the model put into practice during seminars IV and V, students will evaluate the gender impact of a public policy or social intervention project. (20%)
- 4) Research work: based on the specific instructions, a group work related to the taught topic will be prepared. (40%)

All assessment tests will be returned and the possibility of retrieval will be given when the minimum required to pass the subject is not obtained.

- Unique assessment

In accordance with the Academic Regulations of the UAB, the possibility of the single evaluation is foreseen, which must be notified within the deadlines established for the Faculty. Specifically, the single assessment will consist of a written synthesis test on the entire subject syllabus, as well as the delivery of an individual essay on the readings of subjects 1,2,3 and an assignment specific on subject 4, 5.
