To ensure satisfactory results of the course it is desirable to have an adequate knowledge of the basis of Anti-discrimination law

Objectives and Contextualisation

- To understand the basic legal concepts related to LGTBI+ people and women's rights,
- To understand the international legal systems of protection of women's rights and LGTBI+'s rights.
- To identify the different Internatinal Organizations and European Institutions that develop gender policies and guarantee LGTBI+ and women's rights, as well as the and evolution of such public policies in the ELI.
- To understand the European and International instruments of protection of women's rights and LGTBI+people's rights.
- To know the practice of International Courts and Control Institutions in matters of gender and LGTBI+.
- To obtain a critical vision of the policies and actions taken on gender matters and on the development of women's and LGTBI+ people's rights at the international level, as well as to recognize the advances and setbacks experienced in that field.

Methodology

The learning process is based on the student's work through their self-study, reading texts, searching for documentation and preparing papers. Professors are in charge of providing students with theoretical

explanations and raising questions as well as adequate guidance to provide the student with the necessary skills for the correct understanding of the legal issues that may arise, with the necessary tools to solve them.

That consists of different activities that will be performed during the classes, such as case studies, comments on case law, lectures, presentations, debates, etc.

The schedule of the activities will be available online at "Campus Virtual" site before the beginning of the course.

The teaching methodology and the assessment may undergo some modifications depending on the restrictions on in-class attendance that might be imposed by the authorities.

Annotation: Within the schedule set by the centre or degree programme, 15 minutes of one class will be reserved for students to evaluate their lecturers and their courses or modules through questionnaires.

Assessment

-Ordinary assessment is based on the following activities;

- a Case Study on Section I (10%) cannot be retaken
- a Case Study on Sections II & III (10%) cannot be retaken
- a test on Section I (20%), cannot be retaken
- a final exam (40%) reassessment
- a Final Project, which will be developed during the course, (20%). cannot be retaken

At the beginning of the course, the professor will inform about the content and requirements of the activities and their schedule. At the time of developing each activity, the professor will inform the students about the procedure and date for the grading revision.

Extraordinary single assessment is based on the following activities;

• an exam (50%)

 a research project, where the student must apply the concepts studied in the subjedct to a topic of their choice. This project contain two assessment evicences:

Paper, which will be developed during the course, (25%). Oral presentation (25%)

*In any case to pass the subject assessment, students must obtain a final grade of at least 5/10 - as an average of all the evaluation activities- and the grade of the final exam must be over 4/10.

Reassesssment:

Only those students who do not pass the final grade of the subject and have obtained a minimum of 3/10 in each activity will have access to the reassessment

The reassessment task will consist of an exam. The exam shall be theoretical and/or a case study and its values is 100% of the final mark .

Plagiarism:

In the event of a student committing plagiarism, fraud or any other irregularity that may lead to a significant variation in the grade awarded to an assessment activity, the student will be given a zero for this activity, regardless of any disciplinary process that may take place. In the event of several irregularities in assessment activities of the same subject, the student will be given a zero as the final grade for this subject.
