Objectives and Contextualisation

Assessment

The assessment of this module will be made from two different evaluations that will be carried out at different dates.

A first written exam will take place at the end of the five first modules of the program, and will consist on a written exam with personal reflection developing the subjects explained up to that date. This test will have a value of 45% of the final grade of the subject.

A second exam will correspond to a test and to a written exam (2 questions), with personal reflection, that will be conducted on the other topics of the program, with a value of another 45% of the final grade

The remaining 10% of the final grade will correspond to the class attendance, which is mandatory at least in 80% of the sessions, including seminars and conferences.

Students taking the single evaluation, they will have to take the two exams and submit a paper on the topic to be indicated, which will be worth 10% of the final grade.
