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The student acquires the theoretical knowledge of basic German grammar and reinforces this knowledge with practical exercises in class and at home in a progression tutored by the teacher.

Oral communication is practised, on the basis of the theoretical grammar, through simple communication situations which progressively reach a higher level of difficulty.

Listening comprehension is practised in class through the reading of texts appropriate to the level by the teacher and recordings.

Reading comprehension is practised in class through reading strategies on written texts of the corresponding level.

Written communication is practised in the form of essays, written dialogues, etc. which the students must produce regularly at home, as indicated by the teacher, and which the teacher will correct.

Annotation: Within the schedule set by the centre or degree programme, 15 minutes of one class will be reserved for students to evaluate their lecturers and their courses or modules through questionnaires.

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## Assessment

### Continuous Assessment Activities

*This subject **does not incorporate** the single-assessment option.*

1) Continuous assessment ("Vornote" = 50% of the final mark):

a) Writing 3 texts (50%)

c) Two partial tests (50%)

2) Final exam (= 50% of the final mark):

a) The whole content of the course will be evaluated including the parts of the mid-term tests.

b) All German language skills are assessed: grammar, listening, reading, writing, speaking and writing.

c) In order to pass the final examination, it is necessary to pass each of the individual parts of the final examination separately. The last part will be the speaking test, which will only be taken if the previous tests have been passed.

- 3) It is necessary to pass the final exam with a minimum mark of 5 out of 10 and to have a minimum mark of 3.5 out of 10 in the continuous assessment.
- 4) The course is passed with a 5 out of 10 in the final mark, which is the sum of the marks of the final exam and the continuous assessment.
- 5) Only those students who have passed at least 60% of the assignments can take the re-evaluation.
- 6) The re-evaluation consists of the failed parts up to a maximum of 40% of the continuous assessment tasks and the final exam.
- 7) Students will obtain a Not assessed/Not submitted course grade unless they have submitted more than 30% of the assessment items.

Important note for exchange students (Erasmus, etc.) on exams and other tests Erasmus students who request to bring forward an exam or any other type of assessment activity must present the teacher with an official document from their home university justifying their request.

#### Artificial Intelligence (AI)

Any submitted work that contains content generated using AI will be considered academic dishonesty; the corresponding grade will be awarded a zero, without the possibility of reassessment. In cases of greater infringement, more serious action may be taken

We must learn to respect the intellectual property of others and always identify the sources that can be used, and it is essential to take responsibility for the originality and authenticity of one's own text.

#### PLAGIARISM

In the event that the student commits any irregularity that may lead to a significant variation of the rating of an assessment act, this assessment act will be graded with 0, regardless of any further disciplinary action that might be taken. In the event that several irregularities occur in the evaluation activities of the same subject, the final grade for this subject will be 0.
