THUMBS UP!!

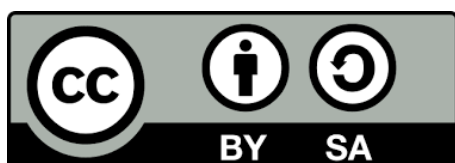
FRANCISCO NOZIGLIA What's up? My name is Francisco Noziglia. I am a plain language text validator at Visibilia. A text validator is someone who puts himself in the shoes of a person with reading difficulties, with or without disabilities. The validator ... points out what other people might find hard to understand in the text. That can be corrected so it is easier to understand. Of course, not only one person does this but more people, they make like a recollection of information to know how much text you should change or how much text can stay. I work at Visibilia as a text validator. Well, partly because of the money itself, LIKE ANY OTHER WORKER. You don't work for free, you work for money. But I also work out of the habit of helping Visibilia and Article 24. It's like a habit!

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
