




#### **INTRODUCTION**


**Organic aquaculture** is a new and little-known production system that aims to cultivate aquatic organisms ecologically. From the European Union there is an interest in promoting it.




## Comparison of organic and conventional aquaculture production worldwide (A), European (B) and Spanish (C) level (data from 2020 and 2022).






