The session was held at the headquarters of <u>CTA (Technological Corporation of Andalusia)</u>, where the consortium partners presented the findings and progress of the first 6 months of this BBI Project.

## **UrBIOfuture at the European Researchers Night 2019**

The <u>National Research Council (CNR)</u> disseminated the UrBIOfuture project during the 2019 European Researcher's Night in Bologna, Italy, on September 27th.
