With issue # 68 we will review our budget and our objectives and inform readers and subscribers whether or not publishing will continue past issue # 72. The price of a single issue is \$1.50 postpaid anywhere in the world. A very limited number of issues #16-23 and #25-55 are still available at the price of \$1.50 per issue. Prices for issues # 1-15 and # 24 will be quoted on an individual basis when and if clean copies can be found. These issues will not be reprinted.
