as they play out their drama around the kitchen table Ralph has done it again he's let that big mouth of his get away from him contrite as always he paces endlessly around that table shrugging his shoulders & making impotent gestures Alice never moves she sits there patiently listening impassively as he gets it all out knowing full well that her bumbling husband is going to take her in his arms & plant a heart-felt kiss on her lips & say: "Baby, you're the greatest."
